MUSIC NOTE

Charles Ives (1874-1954) composed Variations on "America" in 1891 while a student at Yale University, however the piece was forgotten about until after Ives had passed away. In the late 1950's, organist E. Power Biggs contacted the family of Charles Ives to ask if Ives had composed anything for the organ and the family remembered this piece which was then stored in a barn. Biggs performed it on his radio show, and the piece has been a favorite ever since.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

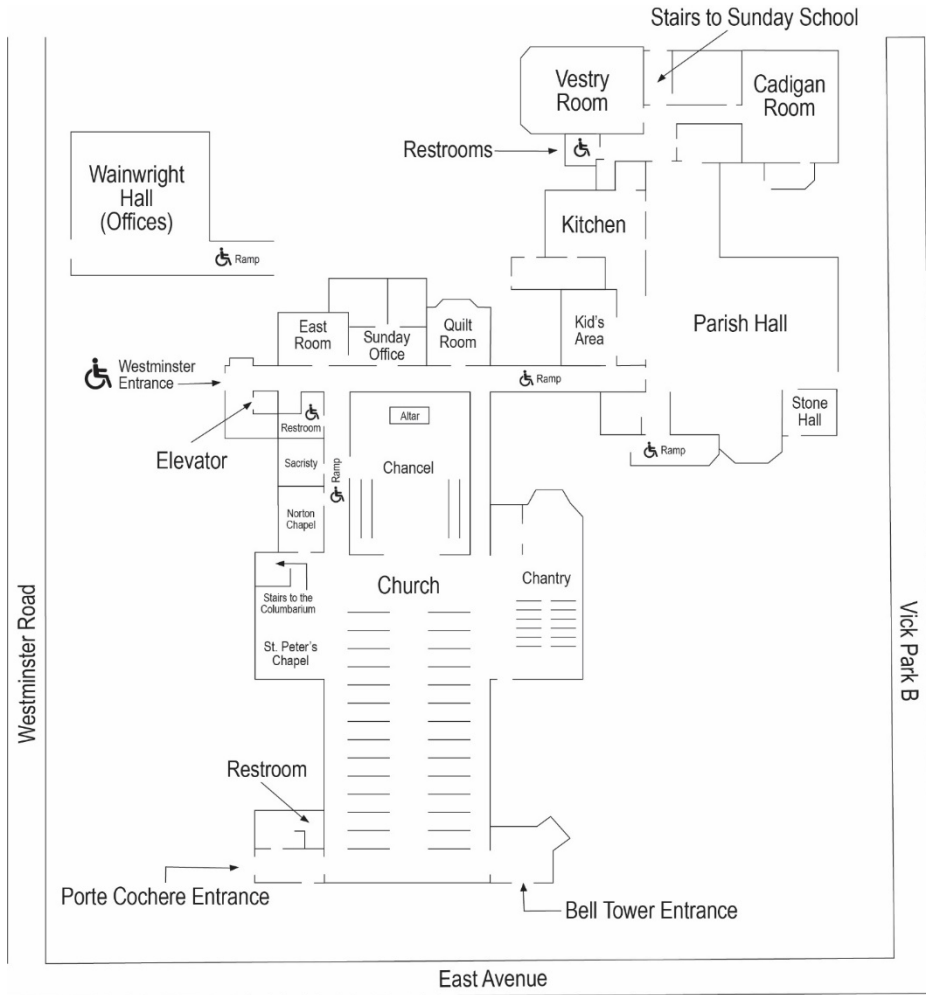

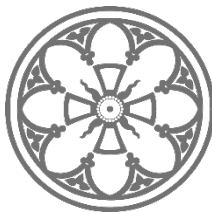
NEWS AND NOTICES
