Thursday Nov. 1 7:00 pm via 200M with The Rev. Canon Tony Lewis, PhD Professor Emeritus of New Testament

What the author of the Gospel of Mark accomplished about the year 70 CE was to provide the emerging Christian Church with an entirely new literary form. More a sermon than a historical narrative, his composition of the first written gospel was destined to aid early believers in proclaiming Jesus Christ to the world and to answer two questions: who is this Jesus and what does it mean for women and men to follow Him. Our Zoom gathering will focus on the sixteen chapters of Mark (the major source of the gospel readings for the next liturgical year) and explore their pertinence to life in the Church today.
