Our seminarian, Lydia, challenged us in a sermon recently with the words of the great 20th Century theologian Howard Thurman. He began his poem, "The Work of Christmas", saying: *When the song of the angels is stilled, When the star in the sky is gone, When the kings and princes are home, When the shepherds are back with their flock, The work of Christmas begins....*

Together, we again went to the manger like the shepherds and joined the song of the angels. I am grateful to all who made our celebrations possible – what a joy it was! Each year, my heart is warmed by Christmas and each year, as I take down my decorations and stop playing my favorite Christmas music, I wonder: what difference has it all made?

In other words, will hearing again about the God's Love being made real in Jesus make me more likely to "enflesh" God's love in my interactions with others? To quote Thurman again, the work of Christmas calls us: *To find the lost, To heal the broken, To feed the hungry, To rebuild the nations, To bring peace among others, To make music in the heart.* Christmas may be only a 12-day season; yet, the call to share God's love in Christ lasts all year.


