



College of Congregational Development

Serving Others & Ourselves Rural Migrant Ministry's Liturgia

For many years, St. Paul's has supported the work of the Rural Migrant Ministry (RMM) and its **Liturgia Rural Worker Education Center** in Lyons. Liturgia develops programs for rural workers, especially farmworkers, as they seek to improve working and living conditions. Programs have included: ESL-Literacy, workshops on knowing your rights, public speaking, and developing campaigns. Liturgia also hosts a year-round teen program, Justice Organization of Youth (JOY), and a two-week Summer Day Program for young people, among numerous other events.






Welcome Organ Scholar Augustine Kweku Sobeng

Augustine Kweku Sobeng will be serving as St. Paul's organ scholar this coming program year. He is a native of Shama, Ghana, and is a doctoral student in Organ Performance and Literature at the Eastman School of Music. He studied Medical Laboratory Technology for his undergraduate program at Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (K.N.U.S.T) in Kumasi, Ghana, and completed his Master's program in Organ Performance at Syracuse University in May 2021.

Augustine served as conductor of the school choir at Prempeh College, and as Organist/ Choirmaster for the University Choir-KNUST. He also worked and trained with the Harmonious Chorale-Ghana, the premiere interdenominational semi-professional choir in



Ghana. There he was a part of several large concerts every year for seven years, serving as Principal Organist. Although he did not receive any formal musical education, he put himself through music theory and practical examinations with the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music (ABRSM), earning a diploma certification (with distinction) in the 2018 Organ practical exam. Also in 2018, he was named best keyboardist in Ghana, and the following year received admission to Syracuse University's Master of Music program with a VPA Fellow Scholarship. In May 2021, he won first prize in the "solo instrumental work" category for the Setnor Outstanding Artists' Competition at Syracuse University.
